### GEOGRAPHICAL VOCABULARY

ordnance survey	gives a clear description of the physical landscape, detailing a range of geographical features e.g. landmarks
symbols	maps contain symbols or pictures. They make the map easy to read.
4 figure-grid references	contains 4 numbers for example 3422. It is a easy way of identifying any square on a map.
compass	is a tool for finding direction
key	gives you information needed for a map to make sense
maps	are flat drawings of all or part of the Earth's surface. Maps may show rivers, forests and temperatures
fieldwork	working outside to find out information
aerial	what somewhere would look like from above, looking down
