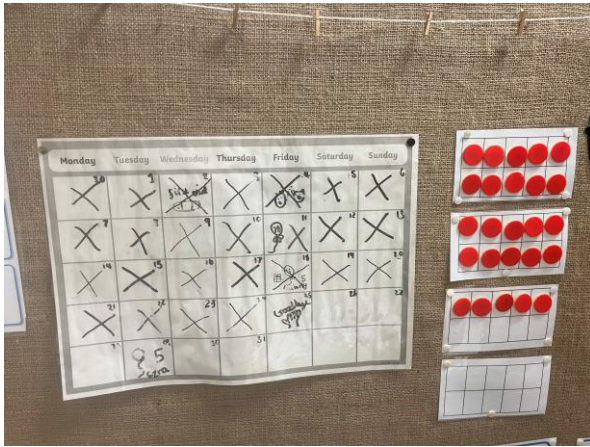

We teach concepts through direct teaching as a whole or in groups. We also add activities/ games to areas of provision to allow the children to build upon their learning.

Subitising

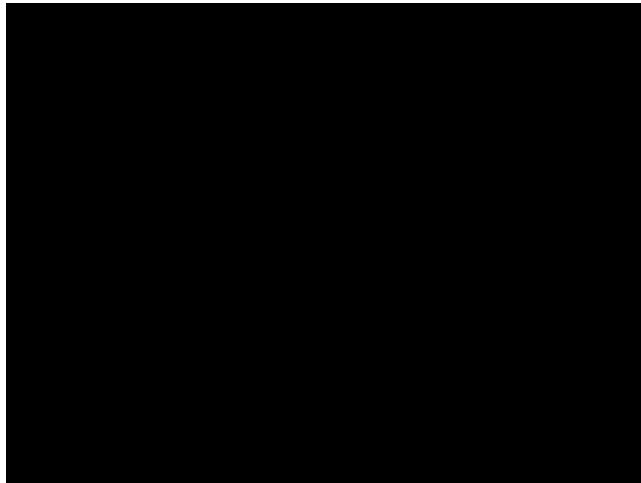
Subitising is the process of immediately knowing how many objects are in a small group without needing to count.



*Children are encouraged to ‘notice’ what is around them.
This is an important mathematical skill.*

Say what they said.

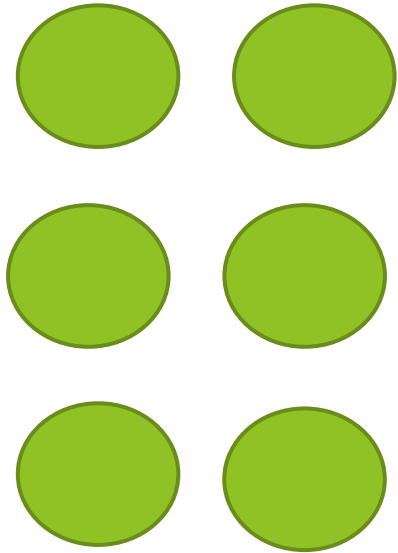
Draw how you see it in the air

Draw how you see it on your whiteboard



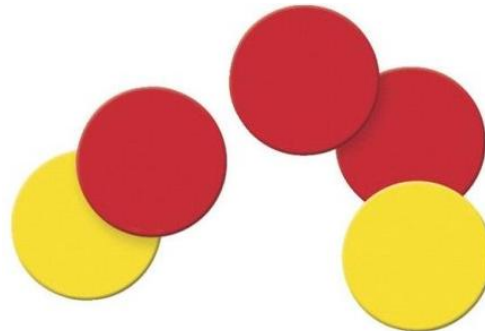
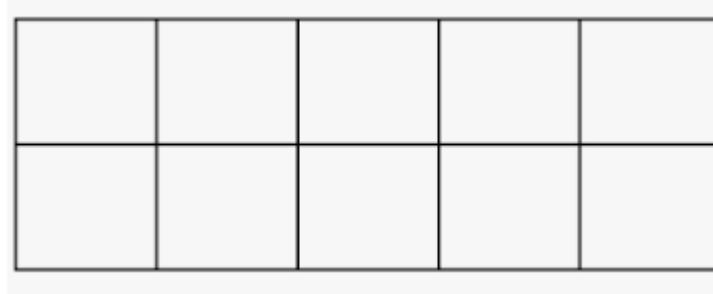
